***UNC's O'Reilly and Embry-Riddle's Morgan Head
2006 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America® Women's Soccer Teams***

NOTRE DAME, Ind. — Senior forward Heather O'Reilly of North Carolina and senior midfielder Katrina Morgan of Embry-Riddle University (Fla.) head the 2006 *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America Women's Soccer Teams, as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America.

O'Reilly, a native of East Brunswick, N.J., has helped the Tar Heels post a 24-1-0 record this season by scoring nine goals with 15 assists. She ranks among North Carolina's career scoring leaders with 56 goals and 38 assists. A finalist for the National Player of the Year award, she has been a member of the United States National Team since 2002. As a freshman, she helped the Tar Heels win the NCAA Division I national championship.

An Education major with a 3.40 grade point average, O'Reilly was one of 11 student-athletes to be named first team Academic All-America®. She was named third team Academic All-America® as a junior.

O'Reilly is one of nine seniors on the Academic All-America® first team. The other seniors are senior defender Rachel Buehler of Stanford University, forward Stephanie Gross of Wisconsin-Green Bay, midfielder Courtney Hulcer of Saint Louis University, defender Ashley Jones of Notre Dame, Jen Michewicz of Seton Hall, midfielder Mary Parker of Detroit Mercy, defender Amy Seng of Louisville and forward Kathleen Vistica of Miami University.

Junior midfielder Lindsey Ozimek of Charlotte and sophomore goalkeeper Lizzie Barnes of Navy complete the first team.

The average grade point average of the eleven members of the first team is an impressive 3.86.

Morgan, a product of Burien, Wash., led Embry-Riddle to an 11-4 overall record. She started all 16 games and finished the season with nine goals and three assists for 21 points. Morgan was one of six members on the team with a 4.00 grade index.

In addition to Morgan, the first team also consisted of eight seniors and two juniors. Joining her on the first team were Annelise Erpebech of Otterbein College, Rachel Zollner of Metropolitan State College of Denver, Allison Elifritz of Mount Vernon Nazarene University, Kiera Vizza of Benedictine, Heather Schlick of Wingate, Stacey Thomas of Carson-Newman, Ana Gutierrez of Seattle University, Kristin Brown of Oklahoma Christian, Julie Karcher of West Chester and Brookie Niles of Morningside.

With six members of the first-team squad boasting 4.00 cumulative grade point averages, the overall GPA of the team was a 3.95.

To be eligible, a student-athlete must be a varsity starter or key reserve, maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.20 on a scale of 4.00, have reached sophomore athletic and academic standings at his/her current institution and be nominated by his/her sports information director. Since the program's inception in 1952, CoSIDA has bestowed Academic All-America honors on more than 14,000 student-athletes in Divisions I, II, III and NAIA covering all NCAA championship sports.
